Discuss:

- Any problems the project is experiencing in starting-up the grant award.
The problems we have experienced involve the delayed notification of grant start date and the delayed receipt of the grant award letter. Two City of Sanger representatives attended the OES training on June 13, 2008. Updated information was distributed to the grant awardees.
- Any delays and/or problems in implementation.
Delays in implementing projects have been due to conflicts with the actual grant start date and the delayed receipt of the grant award letter. After School Programs cannot commence until school resumes in August 2008. Also, due to the budget crisis, there is a concern with the reimbursement process. Specifically, the non-profit community based organizations have expressed difficulty in financing projects as they are already on limited budgets.
- Activities supporting each objective which are not currently operational or in place.
City of Fowler: Materials for the Parent Project have been ordered. Upon receipt, the Parent Project will commence. The instructors are Reserve Officers whom have completed the training for this program. Two referrals have been received.

City of Kingsburg: Implementation is progressing as planned. Training sessions for community partners are still being scheduled. Police employees have completed training and are in the process of scheduling training for school district employees.

City of Orange Cove: Outreach programs, a carnival and field trips are being planned.

City of Parlier: Currently completing application process for the appointment of two prevention officers. CBO Youth Centers of America has purchased supplies and will implement their program when school commences in September 2008.

City of Reedley: A mentorship program at two different school sites (high school and middle school) is in development. Each SRO has been appointed to a school site. Each SRO will be assigned a group of at risk youth, whom they will meet with the assigned youth, track progress and provide family services if necessary. The tattoo removal program is in development. MOU's will be finalized soon.

City of Sanger: The MAGEC Officer will be coordinating and participating in gang prevention, gang intervention and gang suppression details in the very near future. Coordination of details is presently occurring. We are awaiting commencement notification of the local school district programs. The Community of Caring Task Force has been meeting up to two times per month to begin implementation of block parties and adoption of school sites.

City of Selma: Youth in the target area are being solicited for participation in the first field trip to the S.F. Giants ball game. Parent Project facilitators will participate in training in August and October. Meetings have been scheduled with the local school district to implement programs in schools. Tattoo removal program is being developed.

County of Fresno: Gang tattoo removal program is being developed.

City of Fowler: The creation of tracking forms are in process; partnering with the school district and the worship center to create the forms.

City of Kingsburg: The creation of tracking forms are in process.

City of Orange Cove: Program fliers have been prepared for each event and distributed. Participant data logs have been created.

City of Reedley: The Reedley Police Department is utilizing time sheets, news articles, photos and fliers.

City of Sanger: Time sheets, fliers, photos and sign up sheets are being utilized.

City of Selma: Time sheets, sign up sheets, student waivers, fliers and photos are being utilized.

County of Fresno: Sign up sheets utilized. Website has been developed and is utilized.

- Status of the Operating Procedures/Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) for the Gang Reduction, Intervention, and Prevention (GRIP) project.

All MOU's have been submitted.

- Discuss the project's progress to date.

City of Kingsburg: MAGEC Officer Chris Balderas has participated in several suppression activities within the City of Kingsburg, as well as, other City jurisdictions within the grant award area. GREAT Officer Reggie Gierke has implemented his GREAT program at the elementary school level. Total in kind match for this period was \$2,896.49.

City of Orange Cove: Weekly meetings including City staff and community based organization staff have been conducted. Primary focus is to identify participants, form relationships with participants and their mentors and present youth interests for the creation and implementation of activities and programs. Art program was presented and seven participants submitted their art work. The participants were rewarded; this activity promoted positive reinforcement and was a self esteem/self confidence building exercise. Mentors were screened and trained. Mentors have been introduced to the youth.

City of Parlier: The Parlier Police Department has appointed a MAGEC Officer to the Fresno County Southeast Rural Team. This officer will be participating in tactical operations within the City of Parlier and other CAL GRIP awarded cities. Youth Centers of America is recruiting the youth/students whom will participate in the Media Program.

City of Reedley: The MAGEC Sergeant and MAGEC Officer have been working together on four gang related crimes. They have been gathering information to solve these crimes, as well as, develop strategies to prevent further gang activity and retaliation to the four recent attacks. The SRO's and CSO's are working together to provide gang prevention, gang intervention and gang suppression services to the community. The SRO's and CSO's are in partnership with the City's community based organizations; they participate in special events and presentations. On June 27,2008, community based organization "Cruising for Jesus" presented an outreach event targeting gang affiliation and gang graffiti which was attended by approximately two hundred youth between the ages of ten and seventeen. The CSO's presented a bicycle rodeo at an apartment complex located in an area afflicted with gang activity. The event included important topics such as bicycle safety, theft prevention and personal safety. There were approximately fifty youth in attendance. SRO Moles is responsible for the referrals to the Police Probation Team. The youth referred are at risk youth. He made referrals for twenty-four youth. The youth were assigned a combined total of ninety-six hours of community service. All youth completed their assigned hours of community service. Training was completed by three members of a local community group called Youth Map. The Youth Map consists of members from the local school district, City of Orange Cove schools, Reedley City Council, City of Reedley and Community Youth Ministries.

City of Sanger: As the lead City, the City of Sanger has been diligent in the implantation of forms, meeting schedules, securing a facility for the monthly meetings and overall reporting requirements for all of the cities and CBO's involved. City of Sanger representatives have availed themselves during and outside of regular office hours to ensure the proper development and implantation of programs and services. City of Sanger staff is meeting with the Community of Caring Task Force on a weekly or biweekly basis to assist in the coordination of services to the public.

City of Selma: Officers and City of Selma Recreation Department staff will chaperone youth selected to participate in a field trip to a bal game in San Francisco. Programs are scheduled to commence very soon. Trainings are scheduled. The MAGEC officer will be presenting and participating in gang intervention, gang suppression and gang prevention details within the City and all other CAL GRIP approved cities.

County of Fresno: Monthly and quarterly meetings are occurring as planned. Website is updated regularly; postings include information for all grant partners – www.fcgpc.org
